#### **“North St. Paul Area Food Shelf”**

**Support this mission at the Bake Sale on August 13, 2017**

The North St. Paul Food Shelf has had an active life. Over 35 years ago they were organized and served North St. Paul residents. Then about 20 years ago the boundaries were expanded to include Maplewood and Oakdale residents. After many years because of the difficulty in servicing this large an area, not to say an ever-growing need by families for food, the decision was made in June 2012 to only serve North St. Paul and Oakdale residents. Here is how they served our community in 2016:

#### **NUMBERS:**

- 2,575 families (7,875 individuals) and 583 different families were served.

#### **DISTRIBUTIONS:**

- 268,056 pounds of food and gave out gift certificates totaling \$12,875;
- A Christmas bag to each family with appointments in December which included a ham, turkey, or turkey roast plus other treats.

#### **OTHER SERVICES:**

- For several months, depending on weather conditions, a table was stocked outside with food, miscellaneous items, extras bread, etc. between 12:00 and 1:00.
- Had drawings with donated items that included afghans, hair clippers, vaporizers, and electric toothbrushes.

## **MISSION MATTERS**

**“The Bible and Belhar”  
Facing Racism**

The Confession of Belhar was adopted into the *Book of Confession* by the 222<sup>nd</sup> General Assembly in 2016. Because of the racial violence that is happening at home and across the world, the Presbyterian Church (USA) has developed resources based on this confession to help us engage people in conversation about its applicability to contemporary racism in the U.S. and the role of the church. Here is a very limited explanation of the Belhar Confession:

First, the Belhar affirms what the Bible teaches: that all humanity is created in the image of God, and therefore each person possesses dignity and worth granted by the Creator.

Second, Belhar affirms God’s desire that all humankind live in unity-in right relationship-with God and with one another.

Third, Belhar focuses squarely on the church as the central focus of God’s activity during this time while we await the full expression of Christ’s reign. God’s vision for the church was born in Acts 2. The book of Acts is the story of the Holy Spirit calling, empowering, and sending all who follow Jesus (the church) across every ethnic and cultural barrier. God’s plan for reconciliation and unity of all things in Christ is perhaps the greatest theme of the Scriptures and is to be the central focus of the mission of the church as well.

Fourth, Belhar recognizes that in this interim time, before the “age to come” is fully realized, the whole world lives under the shroud of sin. Alienation, deprivation, and oppression are the nature of things. In the final section of Belhar, the confession calls the church to respond to the voice of both the Old Testament prophets and the ministry of Jesus in caring for all who are under the burden of sin, especially those who are the most powerless within our cultures, including the weak, the sick, the hungry, the outcast, the stranger, the widow, the orphan, and the imprisoned.
