SUNDAY SCHOOL CELEBRATION



'Healthy Women Healthy Families' Mission Project Our Mother's Day Celebration Support this mission at the Bake Sale on May 7, 2017

There are so many stories of how money given to the Global Poverty program of Presbyterian World Mission helps out in our world but here is one which shows exactly what one woman was able to accomplish with a loan.

'In a small village in Africa, a middle-aged woman named Linley dreamed of becoming a small-business owner. However, famine and lack of access to capital made it difficult for Linley to achieve her dream. In January 2014, Linley attended a local program sponsored by a Presbyterian World Mission partner, the Church of Central Africa Presbyterian, and learned about a project funded by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to help rural women save money and obtain loans. The village's savings and loan group was established, and Linley was one of its founding members. After three months, the group had accumulated enough money that members were able to start borrowing for their small businesses. Linley received a loan equal to about \$76 to start a business selling produce, such as potatoes and vegetables. Her business grew, and today Linley has installed a solar panel on her house, bought livestock, and secured a four-acre plot where she does irrigation farming. She uses her solar power to generate income by charging people's mobile phone batteries for a small fee. The irrigation farming has allowed her to have food year-round, and the surplus is sold to help pay for her children's school fees. Your gifts to *Healthy Women Healthy Families* support projects like the one that created the village's savings and loan group. Without donors' support, Linley wouldn't have been able to obtain a loan to start her own small business.' *Healthy Women Healthy Families* is a year-round support ministry of the Global Poverty program of Presbyterian World Mission in collaboration with Presbyterian Women.

“The Pentecost Story”

Verses from Acts 2, Good News Translation

When the day of Pentecost came, all the believers were gathered together in one place. Suddenly there was a noise from the sky which sounded like a strong wind blowing, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. Then they saw what looked like tongues of fire which spread out and touched each person there. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to talk in other languages, as the Spirit enabled them to speak. ... Then Peter stood up with the other eleven apostles and in a loud voice began to speak to the crowd: “Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, listen to me and let me tell you what this means. ...” Listen to these words, fellow Israelites! Jesus of Nazareth was a man whose divine authority was clearly proven to you by all the miracles and wonders which God performed through him. “You yourselves know this, for it happened here among you. “In accordance with his own plan God had already decided that Jesus would be handed over to you; and you killed him by letting sinful men crucify him. “But God raised him from death, setting him free from its power, because it was impossible that death should hold him prisoner. ...” God has raised this very Jesus from death, and we are all witnesses to this fact. “He has been raised to the right side of God, his Father, and has received from him the Holy Spirit, as he had promised. “What you now see and hear is his gift that he has poured out on us.” When the people heard this, they were deeply troubled and said to Peter and the other apostles, “What shall we do, brothers?” Peter said to them, “Each one of you must turn away from your sins and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ, so that your sins will be forgiven; and you will receive God’s gift, the Holy Spirit. For God’s promise was made to you and your children, and to all who are far away—all whom the Lord our God calls to himself.”

Each year on Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the arrival of the Holy Spirit as a bringer of new life with an Offering intended to nurture the faith of those newest among us.

As one of the four Special Offerings of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), the Pentecost Offering unites us in a churchwide effort to support young people in Christ and inspire them to share their faith, ideas, and unique gifts with the church and the world.

Presbyterian congregations are finding new ways to minister to children at risk in their own communities. General Assembly programs are advocating for children and developing youth and young adult leaders.

By giving to the Pentecost Offering, we participate in the promise of the Holy Spirit—which is “for you, for your children, and for all ...” —Acts 2:39.

HISTORY OF PENTECOST OFFERING

Since the Pentecost Offering started in 1998, Presbyterians have raised more than \$11 million for ministries that benefit younger members of God's family. We believe we are called to do even more—to support and care for young people as they build a strong foundation of faith.

QUICK FACTS ABOUT THE PENTECOST OFFERING

Congregations keep 40% of raised funds to initiate or support programs for young people in their communities.

- The first Presbyterian Youth Triennium was held in 1980.
- The Day of Pentecost is referred to as the birthday of the Church.
- Pentecost is usually represented with the color red, which symbolizes the fire of the Holy Spirit.



THERAPEUTIC MUSIC MINISTRY UPDATE

As of mid-April, Mary Livingston has conducted 26 therapeutic music visits to people within our North Church family dealing with a variety of health issues. The response has been very positive! Therapeutic Music Ministry sessions are a gift from the church and are therefore free to the person receiving the visit. Money has been granted from the Session and the Endowment General Cash Fund to fund this music ministry program through 2017. **In March of 2017, the Session also approved the creation of a new liability account for Therapeutic Music Ministry. This means that donations, contributions, and memorials can be designated to go directly to the TMM program.** If you would like to make a donation to this account, simply indicate Therapeutic Music Ministry, or "TMM", on the memo line of your check made out to North Presbyterian Church.

The Therapeutic Music Ministry program is facilitated by the Board of Deacons. Mary Livingston, our Sanctuary Choir Director, is also a Certified Music Practitioner and provides one-on-one music sessions to create a healing environment based on each individual's needs – examples include coping with pain, memory loss, anxiety, loneliness, or nearing the end of life. The visits can take place at home, in a hospital, or other care facility. Mary plays keyboard, accordion, or harp depending on the needs or preferences of the individual. **For more information, or to arrange a therapeutic music session, please contact any current deacon or the church office.**
