It is a privilege to be able to be a part of North's music ministry in these coming weeks. The opportunity to provide musical support for worship during the seasons of Lent and Easter is just one way that God is enhancing my spiritual journey this year. The first conversations with Karen and Pastor James came the very same week my best friend and I began a weekly conversation that involves holding one another accountable through prayer, Bible study and reflection, and sharing about our lives. The taking on of both these faith-based situations feels almost like the start of my Lenten discipline this year.

After working some 20 years in the church with youth and family ministry, I have spent the past couple of years focusing on composing and writing. I am the author of a little devotional book, Responding with Joy that comes from several adult Bible Studies I led as well as my training in spiritual direction. Last year, I had a work premiered with the Woodbury Chamber Orchestra and chorus in which I am a bassoonist and provide orchestral arrangements as needed. The Century College Chamber Orchestra commissioned and premiered a larger work last November which you can hear on YouTube--if you are feeling adventurous. Currently, I am in the midst of preparing a demo and orchestrating a musical theater piece that hopefully will be produced in the coming year.

Throughout the year, I teach music on-line for the University of Phoenix while also subbing as a pianist/organist when needed or helping out in interim ministry opportunities. Part of my writing life also occurs as a film and classical music reviewer. My reviews appear in Film Score Monthly On-Line and the American Music Preservation webpage's "Film Music Review." I maintain a music blog at: maestrosteve.xanga.com which gets updated regularly as well.

All of these things are examples of how God calls our talents out of us at different times of our lives. Sometimes these are wonderful new challenges to reaffirm and even remind us that there are many signs of God's presence in the world and people around us. May you too discover or re-discover, talents, relationships, and gifts that God is blessing you with in this season of Lent.

Contributions to North Church from IRA's from Mandatory Distributions

With the passage of the American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012, the provision for Qualified Charitable Contributions (QCD) from an IRA has been extended to the end of calendar year 2013.

The QCD provisions is limited to taxpayers who are over the age 70 1/2, and thus subject to Required Minimum Distributions. In addition, the QCD must normally be sent directly from your IRA custodian to the qualified charity - it can't be taken in cash and then sent to the charity. If you qualify and you do the distribution correctly, you will not have to include the distribution on your tax return as income. You also would not count the charitable contribution as an itemized deduction.

This is a "win-win" situation both for North Church and those making contributions.
