We need inexpensive donations of gifts for boys and girls ages 2 - 14 that are small enough to fit into shoe boxes. Donation will be accepted beginning October 28 in boxes located in the Narthex. Some gift ideas are listed below.

TOYS

Small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, small Etch A Sketch®, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), Slinky®, etc.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

HYGIENE ITEMS

Toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc.

OTHER

Presbyterians Women's Corner

The Presbyterian Women's Praise Service will be held on Sunday, November 11. Please join us to celebrate and joyfully praise God for His blessings to us and our commitment to helping those in need at home and around the world.

The speaker for the Praise Service this year is Kirsten Zoellner, from the Minnesota Council of Churches Refugee Resettlement Program. She will have a heart-warming message for all of us regarding her work with the refugees who come to Minnesota to make a new home after years of uncertainty in their own homeland or in a refugee camp in another country.

As a part of the Praise Service, we also take the Thank Offering. This offering funds many projects throughout the year. Below are the 2012 projects.

- --Establish a mobile medical clinic in Seattle, WA.
- --Fund a disposable diaper project for infants in Marion, OH.
- --Help upgrade community garden facilities to benefit single parents, their children and other low-income community members in Cleveland, NC.
- --Expand recovery programs for women seeking a way out of prostitution through the Mind/Body Wellness Program in San Francisco, CA.
- --Provide assistance to incarcerated immigrants and their families in Saybrook, CT.
- --Put in central heating and cooling system at Domestic Violence Shelter in Torrington, WY.
- --Hire a coordinator/teacher with Sudanese language skills to support the Sudanese fellowship at a church in UT.
- --Develop a park with accessible trails and sensory stations for people with special needs in Greenwood, SC.
- --To serve a Brazilian immigrant population through affordable legal services, social services, counseling and English-language training in Ococee, FL.
- -- To conduct additional Camp Noah programs to help children and parents from two disaster-affected communities in Little Rock, AR.
- -- Expand a parent education program in the city of Philadelphia.
- -- Train women to be community health evangelists and improve basic health care, sanitation and disease prevention in two districts in eastern Zambia.
- --Provide funds to accomplish the next step of the school's building program by building a staff house, library and administrative office in Nkhoma, Malawi
- --Offer computer and English-language courses for girls and women in Fasialabad, Pakistan.
- -- Train traditional birth attendants in Guatemala using video and other innovative tools.
- --Help to acquire materials and provide services for victims of HIV/AIDS living within the slums of Nairobi.
- --Promote mushroom production to boost health for HIV-infected community members in Bukoba, Tanzania.
- --Help enable refugees to dry and store harvested cereals in the Congo.
- --Increase number of maternity and neonatal beds at hospital in Nkhoma, Malawi.
- -- Refurbish camp buildings destroyed by fire in Smolensk, Russia.

- --Build water tank and pipeline to bring drinking water to a high-school in Andhra Pradesh. India.
- --Build a two classroom school building that will house orphans and vulnerable children in a rural community in Arandis, Namibia
- -- Promote marriage certification for the just treatment of women in the Congo.
- --Improve children's primary education through enhanced teacher training, learning materials and trained volunteers in Mzuzu, Malawi.

Where: Davenport, IA

Who: Youth who are in grades 8-12 or (age 14-21)

How: Sign up and turn in your \$50 deposit to Pastor James to guarantee a spot on the trip.

(Deposit is nonrefundable unless you find someone to take your spot.)

Theme: Coming Soon

What: This is an exceptional experience. Workcamp is a mission trip in which we put our love of neighbor into action. Workcamp is a fun, action packed week of making new friends, serving others by repairing homes and growing closer to God through devotions, drama and worship. Most of the participants have little to no home repair experience but because of the great training you will find it easy to learn and very rewarding. The number one goal of Group Workcamp's is your spiritual growth so be prepared to see God in new ways and come home with a deeper faith. Since 1977 over a quarter million youth have participated in a Group Workcamp with over 90% saying that they have grown closer to God through workcamp.
