Personal Faith Statement

I hope you were inspired by the confirmands as they shared excerpts from their Statements of Faith. Each month for the next 6 months we will publish two of their statements. Many people have expressed interest in writing or updating their own personal statement of faith. What follows are the highlights of what we cover in Confirmation and Commissioning Class which you could use in formulating or updating your faith statement.

Statement of Faith Points to Ponder, Scripture, and Questions

Write a paragraph on creation and God's will for your life.

Points to Ponder: God created us in God's image, and it was good. In Christ our identity is formed as a child of God and we are united with all believers as a part of the family of God. Each of us is a unique creation of God, with special gifts. God created everything out of nothing; therefore creation is not to be worshiped. God is sovereign and provident.

Scripture: Genesis 1 & 2, Exodus 3:1-16, John 1:1-18

Questions: What does creation tell us about God in relation to us? Does God love us? Are you a member of God's family? Is God still active in creation today? Are we created in God's image? If God is love and we are created in God's image, then is our deepest need to love and be loved? Is God all powerful to be able to create everything?

Write a paragraph explaining who is Jesus Christ.

Points to Ponder: Jesus Christ is God incarnate; fully God, fully human. **Scripture:** Luke 1:26-38; Luke 22-24; Colossians 1:15-20; Romans 8:31-39

Questions: Was Jesus fully God and fully human? Was Jesus fully God in order to give us the gift of eternal life, pay the price for our sins, and show us how much God loves us? Was Jesus fully human in order to identify with us in our struggles, sufferings, and to represent us before God?

Write a paragraph on what is sin.

Points to Ponder: Understanding sin. Sin as defined in the Ten Commandments and Sermon on the Mount. Sin is disorder, not being perfect, sins of omission, separation from God, an act of self-betrayal, all have sinned etc. Be careful to avoid legalism. Total depravity. Relate to Prayer of Confession in worship service.

Scripture: Genesis 3; Exodus 20; Deuteronomy 6:4-5; Matthew 5-7; Mark 12:28-31 **Questions:** Does Jesus' commandment to love God and our neighbors sum up the Ten Commandments and define sin? Does Jesus command to love God and others include more than just breaking the Ten Commandments? Would it include things we fail to do such as: not defending a classmate that is being teased, not helping a friend, walking by a homeless person, or not spending time with God in prayer?

Write a paragraph on grace and how Jesus saves us from our sins.

Points to Ponder: The atoning work of Jesus Christ. Understanding Justification and Sanctification

Questions: Why did Jesus die for us on the cross? How does what Jesus did restore our relationship with God? How is it that God accepts us and pardons us from our sins? Can we earn forgiveness or save ourselves from sin? Is grace the free gift of God's love with no strings attached?

Write a paragraph on the Holy Spirit and the Word of God.

Points to Ponder: The work of the Holy Spirit as, prophet, priest, king, and communicator horizontally between believers and vertically with God and Jesus Christ. The concept of the Trinity. The Word of God is Jesus Christ. Scripture and Scripture proclaimed is the Word of God, because it bears witness to the Word Jesus Christ.

Scripture: Romans 8:26-27; I Corinthians 6:19-20,12:13; John 14; 2 Timothy 3:14-17

Questions: Does the Holy Spirit help you and me understand God and explain God to other people? What is the Word of God? Is it Scripture, Jesus, and the preached word? Did the Holy Spirit have a role in inspiring people to write the Bible or is the Bible just another book? Does the Holy Spirit help us understand the Bible? Does the Holy Spirit connect or unite us with God and other Christians?

Write a paragraph on the church and its mission.

Points to Ponder: All believers are saints and are members of the one church universal. Jesus Christ is the head of the one church which units all believers living and dead. Every person is equipped with unique gifts to carry out the mission of the church to bear witness to God's love for the world in Jesus Christ.

Scripture: Matthew 25:37-40, 28:19-20; Ephesians 4:32; 1 Corinthians 12:4-27; Acts 2:37-47.

Questions: Is the church a building or a group of believers in Jesus? Do the people of the church have anything in common that unites them? Is the church the only organization that helps people? If not, then what makes the church different than these other organizations? Is the mission of the church to share God's love with everyone?

Write a paragraph on the sacraments i.e. baptism and the Lord's Supper.

Points to Ponder: The church celebrates two sacraments: Baptism and the Lord's Supper, which are visible signs and seals of the invisible redeeming grace of God, which the Word proclaims. In Baptism, by the work of the Holy Spirit, a person dies to sin, receives new life in Jesus Christ and is incorporated into the body of Christ. In the Lord's Supper, by the work of the Holy Spirit, we give thanks, remember and proclaim Jesus Christ, receive Christ's sustaining presence, renew our commitment to the Triune God and are united with all believers of every place and time.

Scripture: Mark 1:1-11; Ephesians 4:1-6; Romans 6:3-4; Mark 14:22-25; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26; John 6:31-35,47-51

Do we renew our commitment to follow Christ?

Questions: Did Jesus do both of the sacraments himself? Is a sacrament a visible sign of God's love and grace? In baptism does the water signify the washing away of our sins? Is baptism a sign that we are a member of God's family? When we celebrate the Lord's Supper, do we remember Christ's sacrifice for us on the cross? Are we nourished spiritually by God's presence with us? Are we united with Jesus and all believers? Do we give thanks for what Jesus has done for us?

Write a paragraph on how you will try to live your life as a disciple of Christ and how you plan to participate in the worship and mission of the church.

Points to Ponder: Christian living is marked by servanthood out of gratitude. We desire to follow Jesus' example by offering obedience to God, serving others, and discipleship. Neither the church nor any individual, except Christ, is a perfect example of sinlessness. However, we should constantly be striving to conform to God's will revealed by Christ and witnessed by Scripture.

My Statement of Faith Austin Holweger

When God created the world, it says it took him seven days. That makes me think of all he created the birds, seas, us, and all the other creatures in the world. The fact he can do so much with nothing at his disposal just amazes me . How he could do it all, and that we are just so little yet he made us in his image that he loved us so much he would give us such an honor.

He also gave us our own talents, so that we can live in this world and take care of it. He gave us all a little something as a gift, to live a good life. Some of us don't know what our talents are yet. But God does. He wants us to use them to help spread peace and his love around the world to help others and to worship him.

God even sent us his only son to help us live our lives and live good ones. He sent his son Jesus Christ, God's first and only son, a carpenter, fully human and fully god. Jesus came to us to help us understand God more and to guide the way. He healed the sick, made the blind see, and even made a man who was crippled, walk. He sent us him so that we might have more faith in him and to spread the Word.

He even sacrificed himself just so we could be freed from the shackles of our sin. He felt the pain of man, was persecuted, spat on, not thinking of himself, but us. Jesus Christ, a man more holy than us, freed us from our debt. That was a debt we should have paid. But God saw that there was still something to save, and because of God, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit, we have been saved.

My Statement of Faith Allison Etter

I believe God created everything from the heavens to the Earth. I believe God created the planets, oceans, stars, sun, trees, animals, dirt and also humans. I believe God created humans special. God gave us a brain, knowledge, feelings, heart, eyes to see, and a mouth to speak. God gave everyone these things but everyone uses them differently because we are all unique. God gave me special gifts and talents that are different from everyone elses. I feel that God wants me to love everyone as God loved everyone.

I believe Jesus is the Son of God. I believe Jesus was born both God and human. I believe Jesus taught people how to live. He taught us how to pray, give thanks, worship God, follow God and live a joyful life. I also believe Jesus died on the cross for us. I believe that if I love Jesus inside my heart and have faith in him, he will give me an eternity with God in Heaven. I believe the Holy Spirit is something you feel. For example, maybe a feeling you get when you're connected with God; or maybe a feeling you get when you're worshipping God. When I went to workcamp last summer, I felt the Holy Spirit after we finished painting our residents' house. I believe the Holy Spirit is part of the trinity of God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit. I believe the Word of God is how one learns about God. I believe you can get the Word of God from scripture, the Bible, through music and by seeing people's actions.

I believe Baptism is one of two events that make you a member of God's family. Water is the symbol of baptism and is used in every baptism. I think it symbolizes your soul getting cleansed or having your sins washed away. I believe the Lord's Supper is symbolic of the body and blood of Jesus. The wine or grape juice is his blood and the bread is his body. When we partake in communion, it reminds us of Jesus dying on the cross for us and our sins.

Some ways I show living my life as a disciple are going to church almost every Sunday to worship God, attending youth group on Wednesdays where I learn about God, and going to Workcamp where we are God's hands and feet for a week. I believe these are some things that are important in the role of a disciple. One way I want to be a better disciple is to be more active in mission work, such as Feed my Starving Children, or help at food shelves. I will also continue to be an active member at North Church where I can worship God with people who are like family to me.

From the Personnel Committee

Terms of Call for Pastor James

The Personnel Committee shares the following terms of call for Pastor James. Paul Colton presented the terms of call to the congregation on Sunday, February 24, 2013.

Vacation benefits include 26 days and 4 Sundays a year. The vacation benefits are the minimum that are required by the Presbytery. There are two floating holidays (the day after Easter and July 3rd).

Other commitments that require the pastor to be out of the pulpit this year are:

January 20 Deep freeze retreat February 24 Confirmation retreat

June 23 and 30 Work camp

Each of these days that Pastor James is out of the pulpit require many days of preparation, and requires him to work throughout the of the retreat or work camp. North Church provides 4 additional Sundays for the pastor to worship rather than to lead the worship

Continuing education includes 2 weeks and 2 Sundays which is a minimum requirement by the Presbytery.

A Sabbatical has been established for Pastor James for this year. This is the first sabbatical after 8 years of ministry at North Church. Presbyterian policy supports a 3 month sabbatical after five years of ministry within a church. Pastor James will have a sabbatical from August 5-September 1st.

The Personnel Committee is well aware of the potential burn-out problem in a single minister church. The committee wants to have a program for Pastor James that assists him to continue his wonderful leadership and service to this congregation. The Personnel Committee encourages Pastor James to keep Sabbath and God's plan for rhythms, rest, renewal and service.

Thank you to all of North Church servants who assist Pastor James in the ministry of North Church.
